



Health Leadership Development (HLD) Course

TOUGH CHALLENGES REQUIRE LEADERS WITH NEW SKILLS

Maine's health care environment is becoming more complex and competitive than ever before. As a result, it has become increasingly difficult to find solutions to the problems of access, quality and affordability. Since its creation in late 2007, more than 350 leaders have taken part in Maine's unique statewide inter-professional Health Leadership Development (HLD) Course.



COURSE OVERVIEW

Our Health Leadership Development is an intensive 16-day course that takes place over an eight-month period. Each year HLD brings together a diverse mix of experienced leaders from a wide range of health and healthcare settings and professions to build their individual collaborative leadership skills and prepare them to lead efforts aimed at improving quality and expanding access to affordable care. Participants take part in a three-day Hurricane Island Outward Bound School session which catalyzes individual growth and group cohesion. Mentorship opportunities are also

available for course participants. Physicians and others who participate in HLD may be eligible to receive continuing education (CME) credits.

WHO WILL BENEFIT MOST FROM THE HLD COURSE?

This course is designed for emerging and current leaders from throughout Maine and across the entire spectrum of health and healthcare related organizations. Each class is made up of a diverse mix of individuals including (but not limited to): physicians and other clinicians; public health leaders; healthcare CEOs; educators; researchers and healthcare administrators and managers.
